Isabelle Cherry once again showed her absolute class, winning the U14 Shot Put (11.69), gaining the silver medal in the Javelin (25.67) and gold in the Discus with a throw of 33.23m. Seb Cherry also competed strongly in the High Jump, the 800m, 1500m and a silver medal in the discus (29.24m). Lola Whiteman won the silver medal in the U13 Long Jump (4.59m), silver medal in the U13 Hurdles (14.09s) and placed 8th in the 200m (30.44s). Lily Whiteman won gold in the U15 Triple Jump (11.23m), silver U15 Hurdles (14.77) and gold in the long jump (5.22m). After a massive two weekend's worth of athletics, these talented athletes should be congratulated on their outstanding seasons.</p> <p>Lily McBain and Lily Roberts competed in the final Interclub competition for the year on Thursday night.
