Philosophy

The annual Intercollegiate sporting competition aims to forge friendships and camaraderie between Mercedes College and Saint Ignatius College students. Both Catholic Schools are co-educational and provide a wide range of co-curricular activities for their students.

Students compete for a total of 21 shields across the following Senior sports; Basketball, Chess, Cross Country, Debating, Football, Hockey, Netball and Soccer. While most Middle School students don't compete for a shield, many do compete in the programme, therefore involving all year levels within both Colleges, making the day "all inclusive".

Students from both Colleges are expected to present and conduct themselves in an exemplary manner. They are to be 'humble in victory and gracious in defeat'.

A player may represent his/her College any number of times but in only <u>one team in any one sport</u>. Sports on offer for students include; Basketball, Chess, Cross Country, Debating, Football, Hockey, Netball (girls only), Soccer and Table Tennis.

At the conclusion of a senior match, students, parents and coaches are asked to stay for an official presentation of the winners shield. A brief speech is expected from the winning captain, acknowledging the efforts and sportsmanship of both teams.

The Overall 'Ignatius' – Mercedes' shield is presented at the conclusion of the final event. Students and spectators are invited to attend the presentation.

Rules of Competition

All student selections should mirror the relevant college sport policies. This should provide the initial guidance for selection. However, when discrepancies appear (a level playing field is deemed to be desirable) the following guidelines should apply:

- 1. Usual team compositions should be fielded unless injury, illness or other issues cause player shortages. If necessary, consultation between College Sport Coordinators is appropriate.
- 2. Teams should not be stacked on the day providing an artificial team standard. All team compositions should reflect week to week sporting competitions or KO Competition. This allows players who have made a commitment throughout the season, the opportunity to be involved in the same team during the Intercollegiate Competition.
- 3. Where a school does not enter a regular team in the Open A competition, selection should revert to that school's best possible team being fielded in order of playing merit, for example their Open KO team.
- 4. A player may play in more than one sport, for example AFL Football, Soccer and Basketball, but cannot play in two teams of the same sport, for example Open B and Open C Basketball. Should a player engage in two games of a particular sport whether by accident or design, the school will automatically forfeit the latter game.
- 5. Shield fixtures are designed for Year 10-12 teams. Middle Years students are only permitted to play shield fixtures, if they are a regular season participant.
- 6. Parents, spectators, players and officials must adhere to the Codes of Conduct relevant to the SA Catholic Schools Secondary Girls Secondary Sports Association (SACSSGSA) and the Sports Association of Adelaide Schools (SAAS)
