JEA has overall responsibility for ensuring that the College operates as a Catholic school in the Jesuit tradition.

The Rector is a Jesuit with particular responsibility for pastoral care, Ignatian charism, and Jesuit mission.

Two Wolves Abroad

This volunteer program places young people with overseas and Indigenous Australian partner communities, fully immersing them in the daily rhythm of community life. Placement periods are available for 6 or 11 months. We also offer 3 week immersion opportunities to select locations.

Bellarmino House

Inspired by the sense of community and purpose experienced during immersions and volunteer placements, this shared residential community for young adults is located in the Sydney university precinct. Residents commit to up to four volunteer hours per week to serve and engage with local communities.
