The College Board of Directors reports to Jesuit Education Australasia (JEA), and through it, to the Society of Jesus in Australia (SOJA). JEA has overall responsibility for ensuring that the College operates as a Catholic school in the Jesuit tradition.

The Principal and Rector report to the Board and share responsibility for the day-to-day leadership and operations of the College. The Principal is the Chief Executive Officer of the College and is responsible for the management, good order, and quality of performance of the College, including its educational and wellbeing programs. The Rector is a Jesuit with particular responsibility for pastoral care, Ignatian charism, and Jesuit mission.

The Cardoner Network is a not-for-profit organisation, which provides opportunities for young adults to serve both locally and abroad within developing and vulnerable communities.

These opportunities include:

Two Wolves Abroad

This volunteer program places young people with overseas and Indigenous Australian partner communities, fully immersing them in the daily rhythm of community life. Placement periods are available for 3, 6, or 11 months. We also offer 3 week immersion opportunities to select locations.

Bellarmino House

Inspired by the sense of community and purpose experienced during immersions and volunteer placements, this shared residential community for young adults is located in the Sydney university precinct. Residents commit to up to four volunteer hours per week to serve and engage with local communities.
